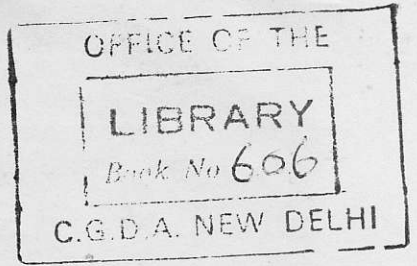

PREFACE.

These regulations supersede the 1933 edition of E. Rs. (I.), Part 2, Section X-K and are correct up to 31st July 1937. When bound together with the appendices detailed in the table of "contents", this volume will show, or refer to, all scales of equipment and stores (other than barrack stores) authorised for a Field Company, Sappers and Miners. The other publications concerning scales to which references are made are:—

Scales of Rations and Supplies issued by the R. I. A. S. C.

2. In some cases, to facilitate printing, quantities have been expressed in denominations other than those under which the stores are borne in vocabularies. In all demands, however, as well as when accounting for stores, quantities must be expressed in the denominations given in the Vocabulary of Ordnance Stores (India), Priced Vocabulary of Clothing and Necessaries (India) and Central Mechanical Transport Stores Depot catalogues.
3. In all cases of new stores, the existing stocks of the superseded articles will be exhausted before the latest patterns are issued.
4. Items of mobilization equipment for which an annual allowance is authorised, will be maintained by that annual allowance where possible.
5. Where the war scale exceeds the peace scale, the difference represents mobilization equipment. For instructions regarding the storage and maintenance of mobilization equipment, see E. Rs. (I.), Part I and Mobilization Regulations (India).
6. The articles authorised as station stores do not form part of the equipment of the unit and do not normally accompany it when leaving a station. They will be accounted for in a separate equipment ledger as laid down in Equipment Regulations (India), Part I.
7. The symbol (X) in the peace column denotes items of maintenance stores of I. A. O. C. supply for mechanical transport vehicles. The maximum peace stock to be maintained for such items will be two months' requirements based on the average bi-monthly rate of use for the previous six months. This maximum stock figure will be revised and amended as necessary each time a demand is placed, but abnormal fluctuations will be explained.
8. The rules for the maintenance of stocks of spare parts and materials of M. T. supply are contained in "Regulations for Units with Mechanically Propelled Vehicles".
9. Stores of I. A. O. C. supply symbolized by (X) and spare parts and material of M. T. supply will be provided by the unit to which affiliated for 2nd line maintenance. The stocks of such items to be taken into the field by units existing in peace will be those held in peace.
